6. Test Small Workflow Improvements

7. Assign Digital Champions

Empower team members to lead small automation or system improvements. Ownership increases engagement and supports digital progress.

8. Institute Weekly Strategic Work Hours

Protect dedicated time each week for focused work without meetings or interruptions.

9. Connect Team Wins to Business Impact

Show how supply chain achievements protect revenue, improve margins, and strengthen customer relationships.

10. Share Executive Recognition

When supply chain contributions are acknowledged at leadership or board levels, share that recognition with the team.
